EDEN ESPINOSA, Host

Actress and singer Eden Espinosa's career, both on stage and screen, has spanned over two decades.

Espinosa is a Tony® nominee for her performance as Tamara De Lempicka in the new Broadway musical *Lempicka*. Directed by Rachel Chavkin, with music and lyrics by Matt Gould and Carson Kreitzer, the musical follows the story of Tamara De Lempicka, a Polish artist best known for her Art Deco portraits, as she flees the upheaval of the 1917 Russian Revolution to Paris. She has been with the show since its developmental stage at the Willamstown Theatre Festival and went on to star in it at La Jolla Playhouse. She is thrilled to return to Broadway and originate her second titular role on Broadway at the Longacre Theatre this spring.

Previously, Espinosa was seen on Broadway as Elphaba in *Wicked*. She made her Broadway debut as Maureen in the closing company of *Rent*. Espinosa was also seen as Brooklyn in *Brooklyn*, the *musical*. She was most recently seen Off-Broadway in the role of Mami in *Gardens of Anuncia* at Lincoln Center. Espinosa has also portrayed Trina in *Falsettos* in the national tour. Her additional theatrical work encompasses performances in *Rain* at The Old Globe, *In the Heights* (as Daniela at the Kennedy Center), *Lizzie* (playing Emma Borden at Signature), and *Merrily We Roll Along* (as Mary at Huntington).

In addition to her stage credits, Eden can be seen in Disney's "Alice's Wonderland Bakery" as the voice of The Queen of Hearts, which earned her an Emmy® Award nomination. Her voice can also be heard in "Rapunzel's Tangled Adventure," "Robot Chicken," "Mad TV," "Elena of Avalor," and "Titan Maximum." Eden's original music is available on all streaming platforms.

CAISSIE LEVY, Presenter

Caissie is an Olivier and Grammy Award nominated veteran of eight Broadway shows and three West End shows. She recently earned an Olivier nomination for Best Actress in a Musical for starring as Diana Goodman in the UK premiere of *Next To Normal* at The Donmar Warehouse. She will be reprising her performance this summer in London's West End at the Wyndham's Theatre, June 18 - September 21, 2024.

Caissie created the iconic role of Elsa in Disney's Frozen on Broadway, starred in the Tony® Award winning Broadway production of Tom Stoppard's Leopoldstadt, and as Rose in the in the Tony® nominated Broadway revival of Caroline, or Change, for which she was nominated for a Grammy Award. She is known to Broadway and West End audiences for originating the roles of Sheila in the Tony Award winning revival of Hair, and Molly in Ghost. Other Broadway credits include Fantine in the revival of Les Miserables; Elphaba in Wicked (also LA); Penny in Hairspray (also 1st national tour & Toronto); Maureen in Rent (national tour). Off Broadway credits include Sarah Silverman's The Bedwetter (Atlantic Theatre); First Daughter's Suite (The Public Theater); Murder Ballad (MTC).

Caissie has recorded 5 original cast albums, been featured on many singer/songwriter's records, and her solo EP, With You, is available wherever you buy or stream your music. In concert, she backed up Sir Rod Stewart in his Las Vegas residency, headlined Carnegie Hall with the New York Pops twice, and has played solo across the US, UK and Canada.



LEIGH SILVERMAN, Presenter

Leigh Silverman has directed over 60 world premiere new plays and musicals. She received a 2024 Tony® nomination for her direction of the musical *Suffs*, a 2014 nomination for her direction of *Violet*, and received a 2011 Obie Award and 2019 Obie for Sustained Excellence. For WP she directed Madeleine George's Obie winning *Hurricane Diane* (co-pro with NYTW), Tanya Barfield's *Bright Half Life*, and Neena Beeber's Jump/Cut.

WHITNEY WHITE, Presenter

Whitney White is a Tony®-Nominated director, actor, and musician based in Brooklyn, New York. Whitney was recently a staff writer on the Boots Riley series, *I'm a Virgo*, for Amazon. She is a recipient of the Susan Stroman Directing Award, an Artistic Associate at the Roundabout, and a part of the Rolex Mentor and Protégé Arts Initiative. Her original musical, *Definition*, was part of the 2019 Sundance Theatre Lab and 2016 ANT Fest, and her five-part musical exploration of Shakespeare's women and ambition is currently under commission with the American Repertory Theater in Boston.

MANDY GONZALEZ

Performer, Disney's Leading Women of Broadway

Mandy Gonzalez possesses one of the most powerful and versatile contemporary voices of our time. She has numerous Broadway credits, which include recently starring as Angelica Schuyler in the hit, Hamilton, but is best known for her emotional portrayal of Nina Rosario in the Tony Award-winning In the Heights, a role she originated in the Off-Broadway production at 37 Arts. Mandy made her Broadway debut in Dance of the Vampires starring opposite Michael Crawford and subsequent Broadway roles include Princess Amneris in Aida, as well as taking on multiple roles, including the iconic, titular character in Lennon. She blew off the roof as Elphaba in Wicked, and received a Broadway.com Award for Best Replacement. Mandy also received an OBIE Award and overwhelming critical praise for her performance in the Off-Broadway production of Eli's Comin'.

Equally at home on the big and small screen, she has appeared in *Across the Universe* directed by Julie Taymor, *After* starring opposite Pablo Schreiber, and *Man on a Ledge* with Sam Worthington. Television viewers caught her recurring roles as Agent Coombs on the ABC drama thriller *Quantico*, and working at the White House as Lucy Knox on the CBS breakout hit *Madam Secretary*.

She can be heard as the voice of Mei in Disney's Mulan 2 and on recordings of the original Broadway cast album of *In the Heights, Kerrigan-Lowdermilk Live* and *The Man Who Would Be King*.

Mandy debuted her solo concert "Love, All Ways" in 2016 and continues performing concerts in prestigious venues across the U.S. and around the world. You can also check out Mandy's solo album, Fearless, available everywhere for streaming.

On the stage, Henry most recently starred in the Grammy-winning, Broadway revival of *Into the Woods* alongside Phillipa Soo and also was in the cast of *Waitress* as the charming Dr. Pomatter. He made his Tony®-nominated Broadway run as Billy Bigelow in a revival of Carousel for producer Scott Rudin and director Jack O'Brien. He also portrayed Aaron Burr in *Hamilton*, in Chicago and on the first U.S. tour. Joshua has starred on Broadway as Noble Sissle in George C. Wolfe's Tony-nominated musical *Shuffle Along* opposite Audra McDonald.

Henry was also seen on Broadway in his Tony®-nominated turn opposite Sutton Foster in the musical *Violet*. He received Drama Desk, Outer Critics Circle and Drama League Award nominations for his performance. He was previously nominated for a Tony Award for his starring role in Susan Stroman's *The Scottsboro Boys*.

As a recording artist he has opened for Diana Ross at the "Hollywood Bowl", performed alongside Common at the Kennedy Center, and his album, *GROW*, is streamable everywhere.



AISHA JACKSON

Performer, Disney's Leading Women of Broadway

Aisha Jackson hails from College Park, GA, where she grew up singing with her family. She's always desired to use her God-given gifts to spread joy and inspiration. Shows that have allowed her to do so are *Once Upon A One More Time* (OBC), *Paradise Square* (OBC), *Beautiful: The Carole King Musical, Waitress* (OBC), and *Frozen* (OBC), where she made history as the first Black woman to portray Anna on Broadway. She was most recently seen on the Asian Tour of *Disney Princess: The Concert*, in Thailand, the Philippines, Singapore, and China. She desires to continue creating roles for Black women to lead and shine bright, onstage and on-screen, because representation matters! She had her television debut in popular South African TV series *Imbewu: The Seed*. She has also toured with the KwaZulu-Natal Youth Choir to Poland and Italy where she was awarded the Best Female Soloist in the Sacred Music category of the Florence International Choir Festival.



KARA LINDSAY

Performer, Disney's Leading Women of Broadway

Kara Lindsay is best known for originating the role of Katherine Plumber in Disney's *Newsies* on Broadway. She then reprised her role as Katherine for the 2017 Newsies Feature Film release now streaming on Disney+. Kara is also known as one of *Wicked's* longest running Glinda's both on Broadway and the National Tour. She starred in the Broadway company of *Beautiful: The Carole King Musical* as Cynthia Weil and continued to portray her role until she was 5 months pregnant with her beautiful son. Most recently, Kara was standing by for Sutton Foster at New York City Center's production of *Once Upon A Mattress*.

Kara began her career playing Laura Ingalls Wilder opposite Melissa Gilbert in the Guthrie Theater Production and National Tour of *Little House On The Prairie The Musical*. She has appeared in many regional productions around the country from Sacramento Music Circus' *Singin' In The Rain* as Kathy Selden to Kansas City Rep's *Cabaret* as Sally Bowles to 5th Avenue Theater's *Lone Star Love* as Miss Ann Page. TV credits include *Murphy Brown* as Callie, soloist on ABC's *The Disney Family Singalong: Volume II*, soloist on ABC's *Schoolhouse Rock! 50th Anniversary Celebration*, performer at the 2012 Tony Awards and the 2011 Macy's Thanksgiving Day Parade. Kara received her BFA in Theater at Carnegie Mellon University. Kara's greatest pride and joy is her four year old son Emerson and husband Kevin Massey! She is represented by Industry Entertainment and Stewart Talent.

Emily Whitaker is the associate music director for *Suffs* on Broadway. She is also the music supervisor for *Monsoon Wedding*, which recently played at St. Ann's Warehouse and at the 2022 FIFA World Cup in Doha, Oatar. Other credits include: & Juliet, Mean Girls National Tour, Trading Places at the Alliance Theatre, The Visitor at the Public Theater, Merrily We Roll Along with Fiasco Theater at Roundabout, The Band's Visit on Broadway and with Atlantic Theater Company, and The Hello Girls with Prospect Theater Company. Emily has also been a proud teaching artist at Princeton and McCarter Theater Center.



SUTTON FOSTER

Sutton Foster is a Tony® Award-winning actress, singer, and dancer who was most recently seen starring as Mrs. Lovett in the Broadway revival of *Sweeney Todd* opposite Aaron Tveit at the Lunt-Fontanne Theatre. Prior to that, Sutton led the New York City Center Encores! adaptation of *Once Upon a Mattress* in an acclaimed turn as Princess Winnifred.

The two-time Tony® winning actress starred as Marian Paroo in the 2022 Broadway Revival of *The Music Man* at the Winter Garden Theatre. Her performance earned her

seventh Tony Award nomination as well as the coveted 2022 Drama League Distinguished Performance Award.

In 2021, Foster reprised one of her most notable roles as Reno Sweeney in *Anything Goes* at the Barbican Theatre in London in which she earned an Olivier Award nomination for Best Actress in a Musical. Her original performance in the Roundabout Theatre Company's revival at the Stephen Sondheim Theatre earned her a 2011 Tony Award for Best Actress in a Musical.

That same year Sutton also added author to her credits by releasing her memoir *Hooked: How Crafting Saved My Life*. The page turner is comprised of funny and intimate stories and reflections about how crafting has kept her sane while navigating the highs and lows of family, love, and show business.

On television, Sutton led the critically acclaimed Darren Star and TV Land series, "Younger", for seven seasons, making it the longest running original series in TV Land history.

Previously, Foster has also appeared on Broadway in Violet, Anything Goes (Tony Award), Shrek, Young Frankenstein, The Drowsy Chaperone, Little Women, Thoroughly Modern Millie (Tony Award), Les Misérables, Annie, The Scarlet Pimpernel, and Grease. Off-Broadway, Sutton has been seen in Sweet Charity (The Pershing Square Signature Center), The Wild Party (City Center Encores!), Trust (Second Stage), and Anyone Can Whistle (City Center Encores!). She has toured all over the country with her solo albums, which include Take Me to the World, Wish and An Evening with Sutton Foster: Live at the Café Carlyle. Additionally, she has also appeared on television in "The Marvelous Mrs. Maisel," "A Million Little Things," "Instinct," "Gilmore Girls: A Year in the Life," "Mad Dogs," "Elementary," "Psych," "Bunheads," "Royal Pains," "Law & Order: SVU," "Flight of the Conchords" and "Sesame Street."

She holds an honorary doctorate from Ball State University, where she also teaches.

Honoring LACHANZE

With a career that has spanned 38 Broadway seasons, LaChanze consistently brings women of complexity and triumph into the cultural lexicon.

Last season, LaChanze made her debut as producer on two shows, the 20th anniversary revival of Suzan-Lori Parks' acclaimed Pulitzer Prize-Winning play, *Topdog/Underdog*, as well as *Kimberly Akimbo*, a new musical by Tony Award-winning composer Jeanine Tesori and Pulitzer Prize-winning playwright David Lindsay-Abaire, earning a combined 11 Tony Award nominations and 6 Tony® Award wins, including Best Revival of a Play and Best Musical, respectively. This season, she produced

Kimberly Akimbo, Here Lies Love by David Byrne and Fatboy Slim and Jaja's African Hair Braiding written by Jocelyn Bioh and directed by Whitney White. In spring 2024, she will join the producing team of *The Outsiders*, a new musical based on S.E. Hinton's beloved novel. In fall 2024, she will make her New York City directorial debut with Alice Childress' Wine in the Wilderness at Classic Stage Company.

LaChanze won a Tony® Award for her performance as Celie in *The Color Purple*, originated the role of Ti Moune in *Once on This Island* (Tony Award nomination), and upheld her commitment to artistic excellence as Wiletta in Alice Childress' historic play, *Trouble In Mind* (Tony® Award nomination). Other notable stage performances include roles in *Summer: The Donna Summer Musical* (Tony® Award nomination), *A Christmas Carol, The Secret Life of Bees, If/Then, The Wiz, Ragtime, Uptown... It's Hot!* and *Dreamgirls*.

On screen, she has delivered memorable roles in both TV and film including: "East New York," "The Blacklist," "Handel's Messiah Rocks: A Joyful Noise" (Emmy® Award), "Melinda," "The Help," HBO's "The Night Of," "Law & Order: SVU," "The Good Fight," "Sex And The City," and Disney animated feature film "Hercules" among other titles.

She is the President of Black Theatre United, a community of creatives dedicated to awareness, accountability, and advocacy. Proud mother of Celia Rose and Zaya LaChanze. She resides in Westchester, New York, with her three cats and gardening hats.




ANNE QUART

Anne Quart serves as the EVP, Producing and Development, Disney Theatrical Group (DTG) and as Executive Producer on the division's current and future shows, overseeing the global slate of stage shows from inception to execution.

Over her 22 years, Quart previously served as Senior Vice President of Production and Co-Producer for DTG. Based in New York City, Quart began her career in Canada at the Stratford Festival at the age of 6. After several years as a child actor, she transitioned from the stage to work in costume construction as a wardrobe manager, followed by eight

years as the head of a busy scene shop built for Broadway. She joined Disney Theatrical Productions in 2002 as Production Manager for *The Lion King*, and served as Associate Producer for all subsequent companies worldwide. Throughout her tenure, she came to hold her title, Co-Producer, for all DTP productions, including *Newsies*, *Aladdin*, *Hunchback of Notre Dame*, *Frozen*, *Beauty and the Beast*, *Hercules*, and *Aida*. Quart is also the co-producer of Fathom's record-breaking film capture of *Newsies*. Quart is married and has two beautiful daughters.
